

Annual Vestry Meeting Year 2022 February 12, 2023

In attendance: The Reverend Nick Brotherwood, Edna & Drummond Hall, Susan & Herb Sioui, Ann & Andy Mason, Judy Evans, Garth & Janis Morrill, Karen Napp

This meeting was held <u>in person</u> at St. Simeon's Church.

- 1. **Opening Prayer:** Rev. Nick Brotherwood opened the meeting with prayer.
- 2. <u>Welcome & Thanks</u>: Rev. Nick welcomed and thanked those in attendance (10) for St. Simeon's Annual General Vestry Meeting for the year 2022.
- **3.** Appointment of the Vestry Clerk: Herb Sioui nominated Karen Napp. Karen accepted. Seconded by Judy Evans. All in favour.
- **4. Adoption of the Agenda:** Janis Morrill moved to adopt the agenda, seconded by Herb Sioui. All in favour.
- **In Memoriam:** We remember and pray for loved ones lost this past year: Shelley Leckey, Margaret Gunn, Shawn MacDonald.
- **Minutes of the last Annual General Vestry Meeting:** Approval of minutes from February 27th, for Year 2021. Susan moved to accept the minutes. Seconded by Edna Hall. Thanks were expressed to Karen for these minutes. All in favour.
- 7. **Business arising from the minutes**: No business arising.
- 8. Reports:
- **8.1 Clergy Report**: Rev. Nick B. spoke to the clergy's report presented in the AVM booklet. Nick expressed thanks to all for their support and is grateful for people and their abilities. Susan commented that we at St. Simeon's are blessed and thankful to have Nick and his caring and compassionate ways.
- **8.2 Rector's Warden:** Report attached. Edna gave thanks to people who contributed to services in the past year. Also, to all people who involve themselves in one way or another within the church to help and support events and projects and most importantly, each other.
- **8.3 People's Warden:** Report attached. Karen spoke on her report commenting on the projects and upkeep completed and considered at the church. Karen expressed sincere thanks to Drummond for his support and expertise with the healthy upkeep of our church building.
- **9. Treasurer's Report:** Herb presented the Treasurer's Report for the year 2022. Total Revenue for 2022: 44 867\$, Expenses for 2022: 67 960\$, leaving an Operating <u>Deficit</u> of 23 093\$. Congregation Equity is: 1 436 116\$

Herb thanked Andy Mason for verifying the treasurer's financial report. Andy thanked Herb for his

tremendous amount of work all year long on financial reports, etc. Herb moved for acceptance of the Financial Report for 2022, seconded by Ann. All in favour.

10. Group Reports:

- **10.1 Lay Assistants:** Report attached. Edna spoke to Joan's report, expressing thanks to lay assistants who have contributed so well and so positively. Edna thanked Joan for her contribution to this ministry.
- **10.2 Family Service:** Report attached. Susan and Gordon collaborated on the attached report. Gordon provides Susan with the order of service and does this usually three weeks in advance. Susan expressed how grateful and blessed we are to have Gordon for his hard work and support of St. Simeon's.
- **10.3 Altar Guild**: Report attached. Judy and guild members Ann and Edna expressed their thanks to all the helpers on special occasions where decorations were added to the church. Now new individual cups are used to serve communion wine and the serving of communion has returned to the communion rail. Nick thanked all who prepare for communion.
- **10.4 Choir:** Report attached. Janis misses the choir but also appreciates the support of choir members now in the congregation. Some parishioners feel loss that we don't sing parts of the service as we did prior pandemic, but we will re-visit and discuss. Janis thanks all of us for singing.
- **10.5 Hosts & Readers:** Report attached. Judy presented the report for Joan. Nick extended thanks to Joan and Judy for encouraging people to read at services.
- **10.6 Women's Fellowship**: Report attached. Ann commented that the Fellowship stays connected with members thru our luncheon meetings every couple months. Members are happy to get together.
- **10.7 Coffee Hour:** Edna reported for Donna that all is going well. Edna expressed thanks to Donna for organizing hosts for coffee hours.
- 10.8 Website: Report attached. Susan has had a challenging and trying time with the website after Brian Turnbull's resignation and mentorship. Susan is now dealing with a new company for website management which has made changes challenging but it's slowly coming along. It was suggested that with St. Simeon's being 155 years old in 2023 that we think of a way to celebrate thru our website. Thanks were given to Susan for all her work on the website. Gordon's videos of the Beatitudes will eventually be posted on the site for all to enjoy. The PLL site is now down and closed and this has also created problems for Susan, but it is being sorted out. Regarding our AV equipment, Susan noted that the PowerPoint program needs to be installed on our new computer. The Corporation will authorize the payment of 60\$ for the program fees. If St. Simeon's is to continue online services, we have to get Wi-Fi service. Is it sensible, with declining attendance, etc., to justify paying for this service? It will be considered for the future. It is possible we could apply to the Diocese for funds from the sale of the rectory to buy Wi-Fi membership fees. Nick expressed thanks and gratefulness to Susan for bringing us up to date on needed technology and feels very encouraged by these efforts.
- **10.9** Lachute Protestant Cemetery: Report attached. Herb reported that it had been a busy year with burials. It was a good year financially for the committee. Trees have been planted to replace trees cut down and to continue to beautify the property.
- **10 A:** Acceptance of Reports: Edna thanked each group for representation on the team that we are and for taking on the responsibilities associated with each group.

Ann moved for acceptance of these reports and seconded by Karen. All in favour.

- 11. Appointments: Rev. Nick appoints Edna Hall as Rector's Warden. Chalice administrators appointed are Edna Hall, Susan Sioui, Joan Painter, Richard Pink, Andy Mason, and Jenna Sioui. Herb Sioui was appointed as treasurer by the Corporation of St. Simeon's. The verifier of St. Simeon's annual financial reports is Andy Mason. All appointed.
- **12. Nomination Committee Report:** The nominations committee, Andy Mason and Jenna Sioui, presented their nominations for 2023. Herb moved to accept people as nominated, seconded by Edna. All in favour. The committee nominates the following people to the various offices:

14. Financial Stewardship:

14.1 Budget for 2023: Report attached. Herb presented the budget for 2023. Revenues at \$49 430, Expenses at \$62 778 for an Operating Deficit of \$13 348.

The reality of the budget is an operating <u>deficit</u>. Herb commented that money in the bank will keep us for a couple of years before having to draw on our investment account. Herb moved for acceptance of the 2023 budget, seconded by Judy. All in favour.

- **15.** New Business: No new business.
- **16. Ministerial Priorities for 2023:** Rev. Nick commented that the pandemic has and is keeping people away. Presently, we are the "youth group." It is all very concerning. We would like to have in-person bible study reintroduced; it would be nice. Nick asked: Lord, how do you want us to be as a congregation and church going forward? It would be nice if we could revive our connections with the other local churches, Presbyterian, Catholic, and United. It's a challenge to come out of the past 2-3 years of pandemic restrictions. Church will not be as it has been, and Nick would like to be a part of the re-construction, which will be a challenge, but God will be there for us.
- **17. Adjournment:** The Annual General Vestry meeting of 2023 for the Year 2022 was adjourned at 12:16 p.m. by Rev. Nick, seconded by Judy Evans. All in favour.
- **18.** Closing Prayer & The Grace: Rev. Nick thanked all for coming and closed with a prayer and The Grace was said by all in attendance.

Clergy Report

Sadly, we had to say goodbye to Lorraine Tilsley and to Garth Morrill during the year, their funerals were held at the church with standing-room-only attendance in both cases. We dearly miss both these wonderful people and continue to pray for their families. I continued to lead Wednesday morning hymn sings at the Lachute Residence usually on the first Wednesday of the month, often joined by members of St. Simeon's, Edna Hall, Janis Morrill, Ann and Andy Mason. Alongside other members of St. Simeon's, I was involved in the leadership of the in-person Lent and Advent studies, the first being held in the basement of the church, and the second at the Rotary Apartments. The latter were so successful that we are holding this year's Lent studies again at the Rotary Apartments. The collection to support two Ukrainian Families seeking refuge in Canada, spearheaded by Ann & Damp: Andy Mason, succeeded in raising twice our target, and demonstrated the congregation's commitment to helping those in need.

I am very appreciative of the efforts made on the part of many people to make sure we are able to continue to have regular Sunday services each week. Especially those who lead the Morning Prayer service, as well as Gordon McPhee and the team who lead the Alternative Services. The commitment of all the members of the parish council and others has been excellent. I want to especially thank Edna Hall as she steps down as Rector's Warden for the past several years. It has been a joy to work alongside her, and I will miss benefitting from her thoroughness and attention to detail. Thank-yous are also due to Andy serving as People's Warden, and to Herb continuing to serve as our Treasurer.

Rector's Warden Report

2023 has been an encouraging year for St. Simeon's. We have moved past the Covid pandemic and are developing a new normal. I believe we have emerged stronger and more resilient as a result.

St. Simeon's continues to hold services every Sunday. The first Sunday of the month being a Lay led service of Morning Prayer, the third Sunday, a Family service led by Gordon McPhee and on the second and fourth Sunday we participate in Holy Communion under Rev. Nick's leadership.

This summer we shared services with Lachute United Church. In July when our church was closed we were invited to attend services at the United Church. In August, the services alternated between the two churches. It was very gratifying and encouraging to worship together as one. The comradery that was shared was evident in the lively coffee hours following the services. It is our hope to have more services that are common in the future.

Easter and Christmas were marked by special services. Services were held on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday and the glorious celebration on Easter Sunday. Advent was highlighted with the Lessons and Carols Service. Christmas was celebrated with Holy Communion at the regular time. At the 4 PM Family Service, it was gratifying to see so many of our younger members. We were treated to music by the Smith/Mason ensemble under the leadership of Andy Mason. We feel very fortunate that we are able to offer these services.

Many people participate in the services each week; the Lay Assistants, Sue, Joan, Andy and Edna; the musicians Janis, Andy, Nick and Gordon; Sue who creates the beautiful slides; Gordon who leads the Family Service and Rev. Nick whose guidance and unwavering support makes it possible for St. Simeon's to offer services. As you will read in the Group Reports, there are many who give of their time and energy to provide meaningful worship each week and for that we are thankful.

Two Bible Studies were offered this year. The Lenten Study entitled 'The Final Week' by John Birch was held each Wednesday morning during Lent in the Church Hall. For the Advent Bible Study entitled ' Journeying the Way of Love' produced by the Episcopal Church of New York City, we changed location and held the study in the Common Room of the Rotary Apartments. Both studies were well received. It was most rewarding to have these ecumenical studies. Our thanks to Sue Sioui and Rev. Nick for initiating and organizing these programs.

Andy and Ann Mason initiated a major Outreach Project to support two local Ukrainian families. The report is attached. The results were truly gratifying and we thank all involved in this endeavor.

This year we had three graduates from the fouryear Education for Ministry course, Cathy Brown, Sue Sioui and myself. Congratulations to all.

The regular church business continues at the monthly Parish Council meetings. The diligence of Herb Sioui, our Treasurer, who keeps our financial affairs in excellent order, is appreciated. Andy Mason and Karen Napp, Wardens, consistently attend to all matters that ensure St. Simeon's is a well-maintained and welcoming church. The input of each member of the Council is greatly appreciated as we look for new ways to enrich the life of St. Simeon's.

It has been a pleasure to serve as Rector's Warden during the past few years. The leadership and support of Rev. Nick has been unwavering as has been the support of the Wardens, Karen and Andy, and the congregation. St. Simeon's is a very resilient and forward-looking community and we look to the future with confidence.

People's Wardens Report

As part of St. Simeon's Parish Council, most of People's Warden's responsibilities rest with the general maintenance of the building.

During the year basic maintenance work was carried out including window repair, dealing with water infiltration, sink repair and general cleaning. This year pew cushions were professionally cleaned and refitted by Karen. Near the end of the year, a new vacuum cleaner was purchased. For this winter season, Corey Haldimand has been hired for snow clearing.

Discussion continues to take place between St. Simeon's and the owners of Pub Sir John. The Pub has use of the back portion of our lot and has assumed general care of that area. We will continue to work with them to ensure that our agreement remains suitable for both parties.

Several projects initially scheduled for 2023 were not able to be completed partially due to financial reasons but more frequently because of difficulty in finding contractors able to do the work.

However it is expected that work on the church roof, ceiling tiles in both the church and in the basement will be done. Work also needs to be done on the back west side entrance of the church. Some inside painting is also being considered.

Other major projects may eventually need to take place including work to prevent water infiltration on the east side of the church. At this point further discussion is required.

For many years, Jean Guy Demers has so faithfully maintained the church and rectory properties, mowing in the summer and snow clearing in the winter. We were all very sad to hear that Jean Guy died recently. We offer our sincere condolences to his family and friends.

It has again been a pleasure to work with so many dedicated people to help St. Simeon's continue to be an important and positive part of our Laurentian community.

Ukrainian Outreach

During the year, an outreach project to support two locally based Ukrainian refugee families was launched.

Vika and Alex arrived with their two children in July of 2022. The family initially settled in Grenville and intends to stay permanently in Canada. Both parents have been able to acquire jobs and their children are attending school.

Yuriy and his wife Marina began the process of moving to Canada seven months after the outbreak of war in Ukraine. Marina, 8 months pregnant, arrived in Canada in December 2022. Their healthy baby was born in March 2023 and Yuriy arrived shortly after that exciting event. He is presently working for a Canadian Company.

Although our initial goal was to raise \$2000 in total, parishioners, along with family members and friends, enabled St. Simeon's to present cheques of \$3045 to each of the two refugee families.

We would like to thank Heather Usher and Joel Hay who were our contact people with the two families. They have also been instrumental in helping each Ukrainian family settle into Canadian life.

Of course, we extend a very special thank you to all of you who donated so generously to this Ukrainian Outreach Project.
